Bhutan observed the 72nd anniversary of the establishment of the United Nations on 24th October 2017 with the lighting of 1000 butter lamps in the Kuenray of Tashichhodzong.

Lyonpo Dawa Gyeltshen, Minister of Home & Cultural Affairs, the Chief Guest of the UN Day celebration led the lighting of the 1000 butter lamps. The UN Day marks the day on which the UN Charter entered into force on October 24, 1945. The function was attended by Parliamentarians, Senior Government Officials, Former Ambassadors of Bhutan to the United Nations, Representatives and officials of the UN and its Specialized agencies and Members of the Diplomatic Community based in Thimphu.

The Chief Guest highlighted the contributions made by the United Nations towards the socio-economic development of Bhutan. He expressed the Royal Government's appreciation to the UN and its Agencies for their support and cooperation in advancing the partnership.
