As a close friend and neighbor, it pains us to see such suffering inflicted upon the people of Sri Lanka arising from the horrific acts of terror perpetrated on 21st of April.

In Bhutan, upon learning of the shocking news, His Majesty the King and Her Majesty the Queen of Bhutan offered special prayers and graced, with the Prime Minister and other senior members of government, ceremonies lighting thousands of butter lamps at our most sacred temples across the country.

The Government and people of Bhutan stand in full solidarity with Sri Lanka, and extend our heartfelt condolences and prayers to her people and government.

Our sympathies go out to all governments whose nationals lost their lives and fell victim to these brutal acts, and we wish the injured speedy recovery.
